What We Can Do Together



Educate

- Practitioner education
- Seek other legitimate methods of treatment
- “Start low and go slow” when prescribed controlled substances



Secure

- Protect prescriptions like valuables
- Keep track of pills and refills
- Control drugs prescribed to teens



Dispose

- Properly dispose of unused or expired medicine
- Do not share, sell, or keep unused medicine

Three-pronged approach:

- **Diversion Control**

Actions against DEA registrants operating outside the law and engagement with manufacturers, wholesalers, pharmacies, and practitioners

- **Law Enforcement**

Coordinated actions against drug cartels and heroin traffickers in specific communities

- **Community Outreach**

Forming local partnerships to empower communities and foster prevention

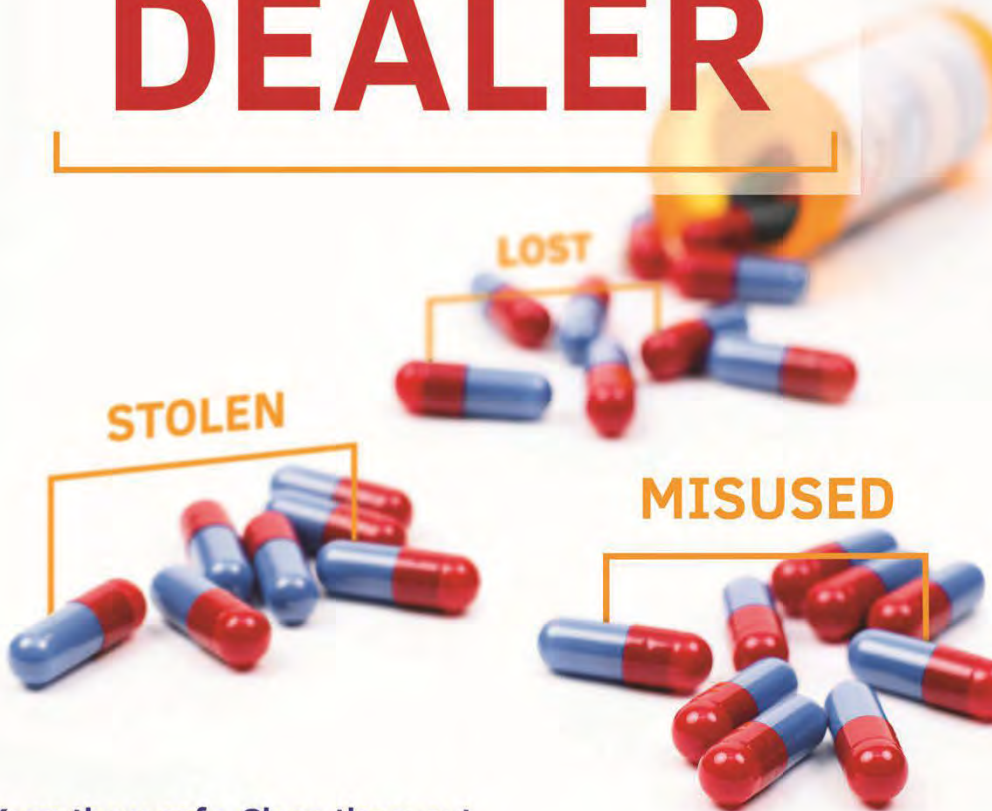

Chapackdee pleaded guilty to conspiracy to distribute marijuana and conspiracy to commit money laundering. 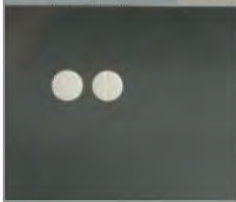
